San Diego- November 4, 2009- Jean Isaacs San Diego Dance Theater will transform Dance Place San Diego into a Sexy, Smart Cabaret for 4 evenings of contemporary dance this January. Cabaret Dances has been presented at the San Diego Museum of Art and most recently, at Anthology Supper Club. This year, Isaacs wanted to bring audiences "home" to see where dance is made....and presented.

Dance Place is one of 26 renovated historic buildings at the NTC Promenade Arts and Culture district in Point Loma. Once a training building for Navy recruits, Dance Place is 20,000 square feet of state-of-the-art studios, rehearsal space, galleries, offices and for four Saturdays in January - a stylish and classy cabaret!

Jean Isaacs and her company continue to make viewing dance a new adventure by programming their annual **Cabaret Dances 2010** in this exciting new venue. "These will truly be an intimate evenings as there are only 100 seats for each performance. This gives our patrons a chance to really feel the heat of the dance!" Food and beverages will be available for sale before and after the performances. And the studio will be transformed for the first time by professional lighting courtesy of Pamela Sherman Keel.

The sizzling, sexy and steamy program takes its cue from the mood and atmosphere of a nightclub and includes excerpts from Isaacs' "Tales from a Marriage," just recently presented to acclaim in Mexico City. A highlight from "Tales" is a steamy and emotional duet performed by John Diaz and Bradley Lundberg set to Jeff Buckley's "Hallelujah."

The intimate evening also features world premiere of "When Strangers Meet" choreographed to music from "Silk Road Journeys" by Yo-Yo Ma and his Silk Road Ensemble. Begun as a duet for Summer Jones and Trystan Loucado, the new work features folk and traditional music from India, China, Finland, Azerbaijan and other

exotic locations. The dance reflects the odd sequencing and stabbing uncertainties embedded in this music.

Other featured company dancers include Blythe Barton, John Diaz, Anthony Diaz, Annie Boyer, Bradley Lundberg, Liv Isaacs-Nollet, Erica Nordin Ruse and Minaqua McPherson. Also featuring Steve Baker on piano.
